Our Progress → and What We Learned

Connected with municipalities and water service providers where water services are provided by the private sector.

Learned that for water reuse to be initiated, there needs to be demand from either citizens or from regulatory bodies.

Interviewed government regulators, with outreach still ongoing.

Learned about concerns for water reuse, and the need for education and certification.

Connected with reuse proponents from across Canada at the 2018 National Water and Wastewater Conference.

Learned some primary barriers to implementing reuse projects, including: lack of regulations, economic justification, and political drivers.

In 2019, we will be:

- **Conducting** focus groups with the public
- **Hosting** dialogue workshops with special interest groups.
- **Launching** our water reuse website
